### **Regular Meeting**

Mayor Schoenig motions to open the regular meeting, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.

- 1. Tree Lighting & Caroling Parade Permit Application
  - 1.1. Amy Campanaro, Director of the Southeast Museum, requests permission for the annual caroling and tree lighting parade on Saturday, December 3, 2016 from 5:00 P.M. to 6:30 P.M. starting at 67 Main Street and marching and singing to the tree in front of 20 Main Street for the lighting and then back to Village Hall for refreshments graciously provided by the Village Board of Trustees. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the parade permit for the event as written waiving all fees, Ms. Campanaro to notify the fire department of the activity, Trustee Bryde 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
- 2. Monthly Reports
  - 2.1. Police Reports for September & October. Chief Del Gardo delivers the September and October police reports.
    - 2.1.1.Trustee Bryde asks about the difference in the number of speeding tickets between Septembers's eleven to October's fifty-five. Chief Del Gardo says he has dedicated an officer and vehicle to traffic enforcement and that is the difference. Trustee Bryde asks about the suspicious vehicle. Chief Del Gardo says it was a 911 call that was checked out. Trustee Bryde asks about the disorderly person. Chief Del Gardo says sometimes the individual has been drinking other times not. Trustee Bryde asks about the criminal mischief. Chief Del Gardo says that is destruction of property. Trustee Bryde asks about the assists outside the village three times each month. Chief Del Gardo says the assists were not too far outside the Village and mostly domestic calls where we backed up the State Police or Sherriff. Deputy Mayor Piccini asks if there is a common theme or repeated calls for the same Emotionally Disturbed Persons and or Intoxicated individuals. Chief Del Gardo says sometimes there are repeat calls for the same person but not always. Trustee Bryde asks about K-9 Falco's condition and response to treatment. Chief Del Gardo says the Veterinarian says he is doing well. The tumors are shrinking from treatment which is a good sign. Trustee Bryde asks about the parking for St. Lawrence Church blocking Prospect Street driveways on Sundays. Chief Del Gardo says that he put a police presence on the street on Sundays and also spoke with Father Gill and asked him to make an announcement at the beginning of service telling people to move their cars if they were blocking driveways. Chief Del Gardo says the police did not encounter any blocked driveways during their presence and patrols on Sundays. Trustee Meagher asks why foot patrol on Main Street dropped from September to October. Chief Del Gardo says in September there was a concerted effort to increase foot patrol and October was less intense. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the September and October Police Reports, Trustee Bryde 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
    - 2.1.2.Clerk Hansen informs Chief Del Gardo that Suburban Carting will pick-up from 7:00 A.M. to 12:01 P.M.
  - 2.2. Engineer's Report Todd Atkinson delivers the Engineer's report for October.
    - 2.2.1. Mayor Schoenig asks how often the grease traps in the Village are inspected. Bill Scorca says it depends on the restaurant's or food service facility's activity level but at least every three months. Mayor Schoenig wants Code Enforcement to set a schedule for grease trap inspection and adhere to it. Mayor Schoenig

asks about East of Hudson maintenance. Mr. Atkinson says they mowed the retrofits in October. Mayor Schoenig reminded Engineer Atkinson we would like the County to manage maintenance of the retrofits and deal directly with East of Hudson for reimbursement. Mr. Atkinson says that there is now a six month mandatory reporting requirement for MS-4 and he will need Mayor Schoenig's signature on the document which has to be submitted by December 1, 2016. Mr. Atkinson has reviewed the report with DPW Superintendent Dan Crawford. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the October engineer's report, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0. Deputy Mayor Piccini motions to authorize Mayor Schoenig to sign the semi-annual MS-4 report, Trustee Boissonnault 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.

- 2.3. Code Enforcement Report October Bill Scorca delivers the October Code Enforcement report.
  - 2.3.1.Trustee Bryde asks about property registrations still outstanding. Mr. Scorca says they are still the two same ones and they are awaiting court action. Trustee Bryde mentions the Progress Street mattress and furniture she spoke with Mr. Scorca about earlier in the day. Mr. Scorca says the Mayor also told him about it and he contacted the landlord's representative and it was remediated immediately. Trustee Bryde asks about the 60 Marvin Avenue inspection listed as incomplete. Mr. Scorca says there are five buildings at that address and four of five passed inspection but one remains inaccessible and uninspected. Mr. Scorca is working to gain access and complete the inspection. Trustee Bryde asks what uniform code means. Mr. Scorca says it is the New York State code that is uniform across the state for building and property maintenance. Mayor Schoenig asks if there is anything Mr. Scorca wants to bring to our attention. Mr. Scorca says a Cabaret permit or something similar needs to be put in place. Mayor Schoenig agrees and says he will speak more about this in other business later in the meeting. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the October code enforcement report, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
  - 2.3.2.Planning Board Report October. Planning Board Chair George Gaspar delivers the October Planning Board report. Deputy Mayor Piccini asks about the status of the sign recommendations. Mr. Gaspar says this will be discussed at the November 29, 2016 meeting and recommendations forthcoming. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the October Planning Board report, Trustee Bryde 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
- 2.4. Zoning Board of Appeals Report October. Mr. Gianguzzi was absent.
  - 2.4.1. Mayor Schoenig motions to approve the October Zoning Board of Appeals report, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
- 3. December 7<sup>th</sup> Board of Trustees Meeting Date Deputy Mayor Piccini says we won't need this meeting and will wait for the anticipated regular meeting of December 21, 2016 pending formalization at our December 5, 2016 Village Organizational Meeting.
- 4. Village Matters Newspaper
  - 4.1. Mayor Schoenig suggests calling attention to the Christmas holiday trash pickup. Trustee Meagher says that Spotlight Arts is a for-profit entity and is noticing some events in our newspaper. Clerk Hansen says he has already flagged the Spotlight Arts "Elf Jr." notice for removal and asks if Trustee Meagher is sure of their status. Trustee Meagher says yes she is sure. Deputy Mayor Piccini says we will check as she does not want to take Trustee Meagher's word for it. Trustee Bryde asks where Trustee Meagher's article is for the newspaper. Trustee Meagher says she didn't write one. Trustee Bryde says that is the third time Trustee Meagher did not contribute to the Village newspaper while the rest of the Board works hard at providing content. Deputy Mayor Piccini says we will check on Spotlight Arts status but more importantly you were supposed to write an article and you didn't and you say we pick on you but we don't because you just don't do what you are supposed to do and that is the truth of it. Mayor Schoenig motions to accept the content of Village Matters Volume 3 after looking into the status of Spotlight Arts as a profit or not-for-profit entity and to see if we can highlight the Christmas holiday trash pickup day, Trustee Boissonnault 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.

  - 5.1. Mayor Schoenig motions to accept the correspondence sent and received for October, 2016, Trustee Bryde 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor
- 6. Minutes for approval;
  - 6.1. Trustee Bryde motions to approve the November 2, 2016 Minutes for the Regular Meeting, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.

Deputy Mayor Piccini motions to approve vouchers payable as written, Mayor Schoenig 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.

### 8. Other Business

- 8.1. Deputy Mayor Piccini says the Board of Trustees will need to look at the Planning Board recommendations in concert with the Comprehensive Plan and will probably discuss on December 21, 2016 meeting.
- 8.2. Trustee Bryde reminds all of George Godfrey's nomination ceremony to the NYS Senate Veterans Hall of Fame on Thursday 11/17/16.
- 8.3. Mayor Schoenig discusses implementing a cabaret license as violations/penalties are not sufficient to deter non-compliance. Counsel Herodes suggests changing the local law to reflect the desired changes, either higher fines or loss of permit. For example, after a second conviction revocation of the license for some period of time. Conditions for renewal, violations of use permit allows for shut down. A "pole dancing" definition and other definitions may need to be added to adult entertainment section. Other sections of the code may also need to be modified in accordance with the changes.

### 9. New Business

- 9.1. Trustee Meagher asks about the clock being off by an hour and complains that the chime is very loud. Clerk Hansen says he downloaded a decibel app to his phone and checked the clock noise while Mr. Stockburger was in close proximity. The noise level of the clock was no higher than the routine traffic noise and certainly much less than the train whistle.
- 9.2. Trustee Boissonnault says there are grants available for clean vehicles and infrastructure perhaps to offset the cost of purchasing an electric vehicle for code enforcement or something similar and perhaps we should look into taking advantage of that program or something similar.
- 9.3. Mayor Schoenig says that sadly Undersheriff Peter Convery passed away and we are awaiting details of the arrangements.

### 10. Public Comment

- 10.1. Rick Stockburger says the emergency shelter will be opening on December 5, 2016 for sixteen weeks. The Village churches participating are First Baptist Church, St. Lawrence O'Toole Catholic Church, First United Methodist Church, and St. Andrews Episcopalian Church.
- 10.2. George Godfrey says commuters are complaining about the steps from Tri-State parking lot not being fixed. Mayor Schoenig says the cost to repair is prohibitive for an anticipated short period of use.
- 11. Mayor Schoenig motions to adjourn, Deputy Mayor Piccini 2<sup>nd</sup> all in favor 5 to 0.
